Note

The Annual Meeting of Sadberge Parish Council will be held immediately after the Parish Meeting. Together, the Parish Meeting and the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council are often referred to as the "Parish Council AGM". However, it should be noted that there are in fact two separate meetings.

- The Parish Meeting is a meeting of the electors of the Parish, and all such electors are entitled to speak and vote at this meeting.
- The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council is a meeting of the Parish Council, and only Parish Councillors are entitled to speak and vote. (The Council may, however, decide to invite observers to make inputs on particular issues.)
